



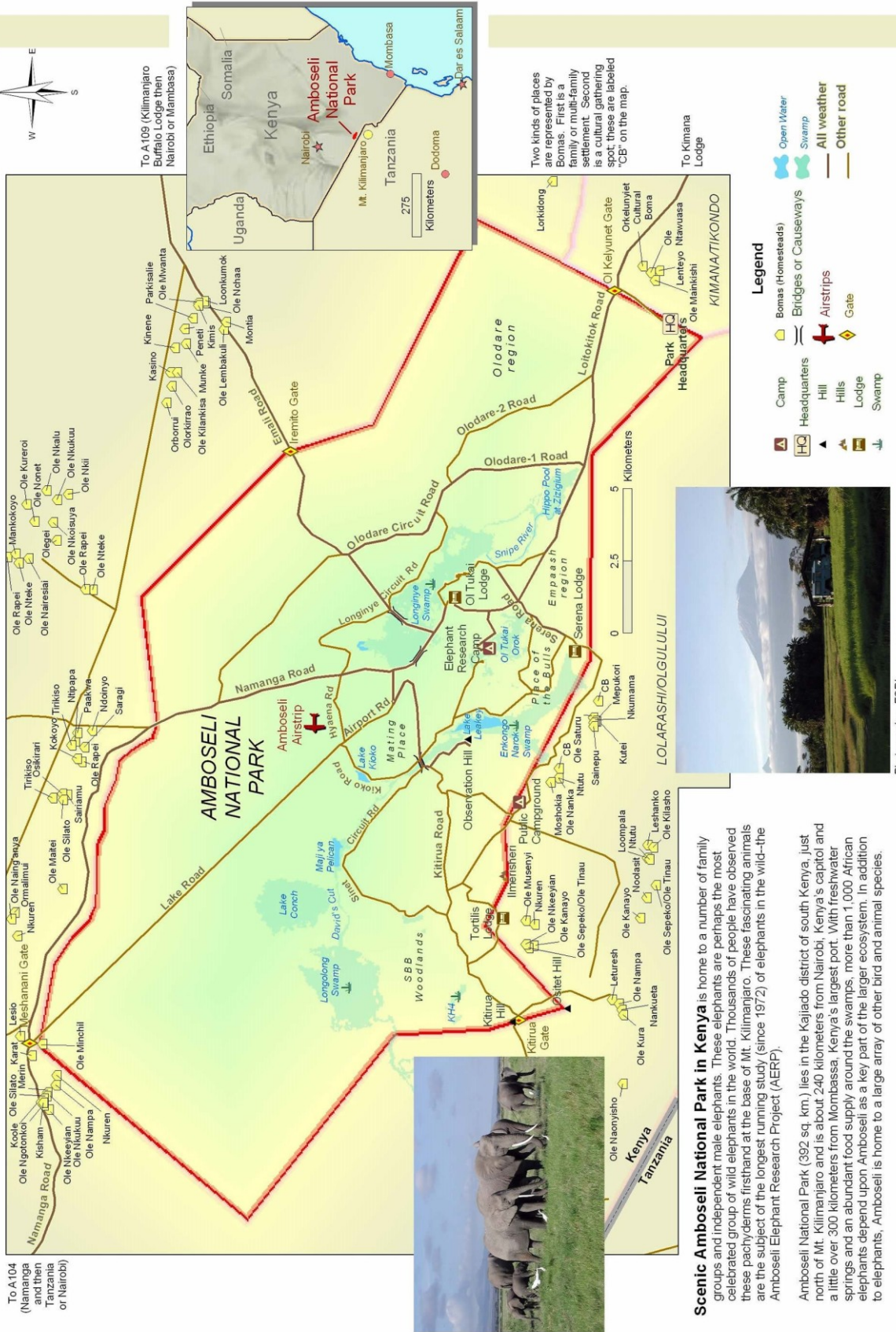

Scenic Amboseli National Park in Kenya is home to a number of family groups and independent male elephants. These elephants are perhaps the most celebrated group of wild elephants in the world. Thousands of people have observed these pachyderms firsthand at the base of Mt. Kilimanjaro. These fascinating animals are the subject of the longest running study (since 1972) of elephants in the wild—the Amboseli Elephant Research Project (AERP).

Amboseli National Park (392 sq. km.) lies in the Kajiado district of south Kenya, just north of Mt. Kilimanjaro and is about 240 kilometers from Nairobi, Kenya's capitol and a little over 300 kilometers from Mombassa. Kenya's largest port. With freshwater springs and an abundant food supply around the swamps, more than 1,000 African elephants depend upon Amboseli as a key part of the larger ecosystem. In addition to elephants, Amboseli is home to a large array of other bird and animal species.
